Engine Procurement

Chief Culp provided a power point presentation on the following cost options that were under consideration and recommended by the Engine Spec Committee.

The next engine purchase would replace the District's 2004 Pierce Engine. Chief Culp discussed the Washington Survey and Rating Bureau (WSRB) fire protection grading and why it is important to keep to a timely replacement schedule. Chief Culp discussed the financing options with the LOCAL (state financing) and alternatives such as PNC and lease options.

Chief Culp reported that price increases were expected beginning January 2024 and due to supply demands the timeline for Pierce is out about 36 month and 18 months for Rosenbauer.

The Board discussed concerns with the District's future revenue growth. Commissioner Belfield stated that he would like to see how the transport revenues come in for 2024 and if they will help offset some future cost for our capital expenditures.

After further discussion it was Chief Culp's recommendation to postpone the procurement of the engine. The Board concurred. Chief Culp stated that he would keep the Board apprised to any future developments.
