

Emergency Kit Checklist

Assemble a 7-day Emergency Supply Kit. It's not unusual for the rural areas of the County to be without power for up to a week or more.

Disaster Kit Essentials

Water-1 gallon per person per day Food-dry, canned, non-perishable Battery powered radio Flashlights, extra batteries Vehicle cell phone charger Tent, sleeping bag, blankets Extra clothes, shoes, gloves Waterproof matches Toys, books, deck of cards

First Aid Kit Supplies First Aid Book Hydrogen peroxide Antibiotic ointment Alcohol swabs Aspirin, Ibuprofin Medications Bandages Rolled gauze Sterile pads



Cash. Identification Copy of important documents Camp stove, fuel for cooking Liquid detergent, bleach Paper plates, foil, plastic bags Can opener, utensils Eye glasses Infant Supplies Trash bags, toilet paper





Personal hygiene items Axe, shovel, rope, pliers Knife, multi-purpose tool Plastic sheeting, duct tape, towels for shelter- in- place Pet food

Adhesive tape Cotton swabs Eve drops Diarrhea medication Antacids Scissors, tweezers Medical shears Nitrile medical gloves Thermometer

Soap, sanitizer Sunscreen Safety pins, needle, thread Instant cold packs Splinting material Antihistamine Insect sting ointment Insect repellent
