CHIEF'S REPORT

Alarms

For April 2022, the District responded to 45 Aid calls, 15 Medic calls, 18 Fire Calls, and 11 Service calls for 89 total calls. The year-to-date total is 322 calls compared to 275 calls in 2021.

Turn-out Times: April 2022 – The turnout time standard was achieved on 48 of 83 calls which was 57.8%. The 90% turnout time was 2:09.

Volunteer Firefighters / E-Shift Program:

- The 2022 Recruits continue to do well in EMT School and should be done by June.
- Volunteer Staff will start Wednesday night drills twice a month at the station. The goal is to conduct group training with the volunteers and career staff on monthly fire topics.
- DC LeDoux and I are starting to work on a final schedule for the firefighting training that the 2022 Recruits will go through.

Career Staff:

- Congratulations to Probationary Firefighter Lussier on completing his recruit academy from the FTA.
- Starting this month, the District has four career personnel per shift.
- Career Staff has completed their annual hydrant inspections.
- Firefighters Patterson and Conroy have completed their shared staffing orientation training at Duvall and Snoqualmie stations.

Training:

- The District is continuing to explore our training opportunities for the future. I want to thank DC LeDoux for the hard work in obtaining information on different training opportunities for the District. We will look at the pros and cons of these options and will present them to the Commission at a future meeting. These options are part of our Strategic Plan Goal 3 on implementing an effective and efficient Fire/EMS Training Program for career and volunteer personnel.
 - o Option 1 is the hiring of a Training Officer to conduct our training
 - o Option 2 is the creation of a training consortium with Snoqualmie and Duvall Fire.
 - Option 3 is joining the training consortium that Kirkland, Eastside, and Bothell will start in January 2023.
- This past month, the District completed a lot of training, and I want to thank all of the members for the time and dedication to complete all of this training.
 - o RT-130 Wildland Refreshers
 - Swiftwater Tech Refreshers with the certification of FF Patterson and Conroy as Swiftwater Techs. This training included Snoqualmie, King County Sheriff's Department, and Eastside Fire.
 - MCO burns with Snoqualmie Fire Department at the State Fire Academy. The Career staff that needs their IFSAC Firefighter II certification will be testing in early June.

Station/Equipment Projects:

- Engine-152 has returned from the shops after a head gasket repair.
- The fence replacement project was completed in April.
- We have ordered the computers and routers to update our MDC and ePCR computers. Our goal
 is to have them in service by the end of the month. We were able to use King County EMS Core
 Funding for a portion of the costs of the items.
- DC LeDoux will start the training on the new CAD system that will go live in July. The new system streamlines CAD at NORCOM, having only one CAD system instead of two.
- Thanks to a grant that DC LeDoux wrote, we have received three additional ballistic vests and helmets.

Grants

 We are waiting on WA DNR and FEMA for the announcement of awards for grants. They should start to announce by the end of May.

Aid-Car

The Vendor is still working on the final pricing for the Aid-Car.

COVID-19

 The District is putting together information to submit a FEMA Public Assistance Grant for the COVID-19 disaster. Melinda, DC LeDoux, and I are working on collecting the information to be submitted. We are increasing our estimated reimbursement to around \$90,000 to \$100,000 from \$50,0000, which will be associated with overtime of labor, equipment, and EMS supplies.

Community Involvement

A reminder that Fall City Days will be on June 11, 2022, and we will be involved in that event.

Chairman Meredith stated that he was pleased to see the efforts of submitting for grant funding and looking for those opportunities that may benefit the District. Commissioner Hansen agreed.

Chairman Meredith stated that the Board did receive two letters of interest from Kris Belfield and Dave Hart. Chairman Meredith stated that a special meeting is scheduled for next Monday to conduct interviews and an executive session will follow the interviews.
